

**AN ASSEMBLY** of Principals and Electors of the Parish of St Ouen was duly held in the upstairs Committee Rooms at St Ouen's Parish Hall on Wednesday 28 January 2026 at 7.30pm to:-

- In accordance with Article 32 of the Parish Rate (Administration)(Jersey) Law, 2005, elect two members of the Assessment Committee to serve for three years, the terms of office of Nigel Hall and David Sharp having expired.

The Connétable welcomed those present and offered apologies from Centenier Robert Hall, Advocate Richard John Michel (member of the Roads Committee), Basil George Carre, Nigel Hall (Chairman of the Rates Assessment Committee), David Sharp (member of the Rates Assessment Committee), Mark Grigg (member of the Rates Assessment Committee), Paul James (member of the Rates Assessment Committee), Richard Renouf and Julie Journeaux..

The Connétable then asked the Parish Secretary to read the convening notice.

Connétable Honeycombe asked for nominations for the role of Rates Assessor. Allan Quenault, Procureur du Bien Public, proposed Mr Nigel Hall, and was seconded by Mr Laurence Armstrong. Mr Quenault said that Mr Hall was first elected to the Assessment Committee in 2010, and is currently the Chairman of both the St Ouen Assessment Committee and the Jersey Rates Assessors Association.

Mr Laurence Armstrong then proposed Mr David Sharp, whose nomination was seconded by Mr Allan Quenault.

There being no further nominations, Connétable Honeycombe declared both as elected for a three year term, and that they would be advised in due course of the date of when they will be required to take the oath of office.

The Connétable took the opportunity to thank both Mr Hall and Mr Sharp for allowing their names to be put forward, and for their service to the Parish to date. He added that the Rates Assessment Committee are a busy and extremely hard working team.

Connétable Honeycombe asked for a proposer and seconder to approve the minutes at the next Parish Assembly. Mr Allan Quenault duly proposed, and Centenier Bernie Connor seconded.
