AT AN ASSEMBLY of Electors of the Parish of St. Ouen, duly convened and held in St. Ouen's Parish Hall on Wednesday, 28 January, 2026 at 7.10p.m. pursuant to an Act of the Royal Court dated 9 January, 2026, whereby it was ordered that an election be held for Procureur du Bien Public in the Parish of St. Ouen.

Apologies were received from Centenier Robert Hall, Advocate Richard John Michel (member of the Roads Committee), Basil George Carre, Nigel Hall (Chairman of the Rates Assessment Committee), David Sharp (member of the Rates Assessment Committee), Mark Grigg (member of the Rates Assessment Committee), Paul James (member of the Rates Assessment Committee), Richard Renouf and Julie Journeaux.

Mr Allan John Quenault, of Champs des Rues, Petite Rue, St. Ouen was nominated on the proposition of Mr. Kenneth Prialx Vibert. The seconders were Christin Hellio, Didier Hellio, James Gordon Reed, Michael John Paddock, Wilson de la Haye, Nicholas John Le Masurier, Hilton Graeme Carre, Edward John Syvret and Susan East-Smith.

Upon proposing Mr Quenault, Mr Vibert informed the meeting that Mr Quenault had served 14 years as a member of the Rates Assessment Committee, 10 of which as Chairman. He went on to be elected as Procureur du Bien Public in 2014, and has now served 3 terms.

The Assembly having lasted the statutory time and there being no further nominations the President declared Allan John Quenault duly elected as Procureur du Bien Public.

Having congratulated Mr Quenault on his election, the President thanked him for his support and advised that Jurat Averty would be in contact to warn him for his appearance in the Royal Court to take the Oath of Office on 13 March 2026.

Mr Quenault thanked his proposer and seconders.

There being no further business, the President declared the meeting closed at 7.18p.m.
